In Russia



The jews, who wanted to destroy all the Christians in Southern Russia and have more direct control over the collectivized farms, starved out the Christian communities and killed 8 to 12 million Christians. This Genocide was well known among the elites of the world,



but wasn't widely published because of jewish control over the press. They owned all the large, international newspapers, including the New York Times, by the late 1800s.

The holodomor (the starving of Ukraine) occurred from 1932 to 1933. In the larger part of that period, from 1917 through 1935, they had exterminated over 60 million Christians.

In Palestine

In 1948, when they came in and destroyed a largely Christian country that resided in the land of Palestine, in order to establish their Talmudic state that promotes homosexuality and pedophilia.

For instance, one jewish soldier talks about the events of going in 1948 and destroying the Palestinian towns and people.

Tantura was a rich village, he says, it had beautiful houses. They lived like Europeans--what he means is that they lived like you and me.

The women, he says, of the village used to wear nice clothes.

When we went in, we raped the women and children. One of the soldiers raped a sixteen-year-old girl, he says while laughing.

And this wasn't abnormal for jewish war. 8 to 88 was the slang from soldiers over the practice.

Anyway, this soldier goes on saying:

One soldier took the Palestinian men, put them in something like a cage, and just shot them all. Mowed them down with a submachine gun.

They covered it all up! He says while smiling, and then goes on to tell about another soldier who ran through another village with a flamethrower, chasing after villagers. Again, he says while laughing about what a scandal it was.

Another soldier says, for the first 4 months of the invasion of Palestine, I was a murderer.

I took no prisoners. People would raise their hands, try to surrender, but I would just shoot them all. Even children, he says while laughing.

The interviewer asks him how many he killed this way, and he says, well, I had 250 bullets in my gun. I would use every one. I can't tell you exactly how many I killed.

And nothing has changed. How can these men laugh? Because the Jews see themselves as the master race. The issue and the tissue of God. They are God on earth, in their view. The Palestinians are no different than animals.

Every year hundreds of Palestinians are destroyed, men, women, and children.

2022 was the worst in recent memory. Over 200 were killed. 53 of which were children. Over 10,500 were injured. And now, since 2023, they have slaughtered well over 100,000 men, women, and children.

And the antagonism against Christians is heating up. Or so there were reports.

To determine if the claims of increased violence and hate crimes directed against Christians were true, on June 26th the liberal leaning Israeli newspaper Haaretz sent one of its journalists dressed as a priest into downtown Jerusalem. Within five minutes, the journalist Yossi Eli "was derided and spat at, including by a child and a soldier... A bit later a man mocked [him] in Hebrew, saying, 'Forgive me father for I have sinned.' Then an 8-year-old spat at [him], as did [another] soldier when a group of troops passed by later."

In another major incident, five weeks ago dozens of Israeli extremists, primarily Orthodox Jews, disrupted a Christian prayer event for pilgrims near the Western Wall. The deputy mayor of Jerusalem, Aryeh King and leading Rabbi Avi Thau led the protesters. Denouncing the Christians as "missionaries" trying to convert Jews, the extremists spat at and cursed the pilgrims, many of whom were ironically normally strongly pro-Israel evangelical Christians from the US. Deputy Mayor King said that Christians should enjoy freedom of worship "only inside their churches."

According to Protecting Holy Land Christians, an organization established by Christian groups to raise awareness of threats their religion, 2022 was "one of the worst years for Christians in Jerusalem to date."

The organization reported spitting attacks, vandalism, and property theft as mechanisms of erasure. And there are other accounts of how Christians have been subjected to increasing persecution. A recent report details how Palestinians have been targeted what it calls settler-colonialism, which is a series of measures intended to destroy their communities and drive them from their land. It identifies seven policies that Israel uses against Palestinians throughout the whole of Mandatory Palestine (1948 Palestine, Gaza, the West Bank including East Jerusalem) and also to punish those in exile: "denial of residency; land confiscation and denial of use; discriminatory planning; denial of access to natural resources and services; imposition of a permit regime; fragmentation, segregation and isolation; denial of reparations; and suppression of resistance." The report concludes "Whether these policies are considered separately or taken together, they amount to forced population transfer, a grave breach of international humanitarian law (IHL)."

Anti-Christ

In 2018, the Israeli government began to consider legislation that would allow Christian church property to be expropriated, according to an article by an Agent of the French Press found in The Jakarta Post. The legislation is primarily aimed at being able to tax churches, which does not indicate religious freedom, but merely toleration, and toleration at a price. In fact, the legislation would have charged one particular church, 152 million Euros, 186 million in U.S. dollars. Such stringent enforcement has historically been used not merely to tax, but to drive out individuals and organizations. Christians may support Israel, but Israel, it seems, does not support Christians. After all, it is illegal to witness or even pass out Christian tracts in Israel. Doing so leads to arrest and finally deportation

In an article by Greg Kandra found in Aletia, the title rightly declares this tax effort to be a systematic campaign against Christians. "Recently, this systematic and offensive campaign has reached an unprecedented level as the Jerusalem municipality issued scandalous collection notices and orders of seizure of Church assets, properties and bank accounts for alleged debts of punitive municipal taxes." and later says "This abhorrent bill is set to

advance today in a meeting of a ministerial committee which if approved would make the expropriation of the lands of churches possible."

All these things have occurred over this last month, February, 2018. What has happened since then? Have they gone ahead with the taxation of Churches?
