Judeo-Christian as a term

This term is so common today it is surprising to most people that the first person to use it in the United States was Franklin Delano Roosevelt. Oh, you didn't realize he is a theologian? Well, he most certain was not in any way shape or form.

However, FDR did not use it with any great regularity and it did not catch on with any great effect. It was not until the presidency of that great theologian Dwight D. Eisenhower... oh wait, he wasn't by any means a theologian or student of the Bible, either! Nevertheless, it was under his administration that it rose to prominence.

He used it as a political ploy to get Christians more lined up with jews.

This ought to strike Christians who use this term very strange! It is not a common thought! And it does not express Biblical truth! After all, there is only one religion of Scripture. There is only one people of God. To divide up the moral foundation in a hyphenated fashion as, Judeo-Christian is a biblically ignorant statement and glosses over the jewish problem. Let me illustrate.

Typically, we hear it like this, "This country was founded on Judeo-Christian principles!"

Judeo... yeah, no thank you. I don't follow the Talmud, and the Bible rejects it! Jesus said woe unto them! For the bind up the truth!

I was blessed to read a <u>recent article</u> that describes how this term, Judeo-Christian, became common:

As the 1950s progressed, the US government and its private sector allies began propagating the new Judeo-Christian doctrine, saturating the radio airwaves with ideological program-

ming, inserting "Under God" in the pledge of allegiance, establishing the National Prayer Breakfast, and creating organizations with the task of re-orienting American civic life around churches. Individuals such as conservative businessman and FBI asset J. Howard Pew bankrolled influential Judeo-Christian Evangelical publications, such as Christianity Today.

This ought to let Christians today know that your Government has been directly involved in trying to manipulate and steer Churches with lingo like Judeo-Christian which has no Biblical foundation.
